Lambeth UNISON Supports Climate Demo

On Friday 20th September Lambeth UNISON members joined together with workers, school strikers and climate activists to hold a demonstration at Windrush Square in Brixton.

More than two hundred protesters came out to call on the government to take immediate action to tackle the climate crisis, and for the council to follow through on the commitments they made when they formally called a climate emergency in January.

We are facing a global emergency, climate change represents an urgent and potentially irreversible threat to our planet. According to the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) the Earth's atmosphere is already over 1°C warmer than preindustrial levels. If drastic change is not

made it is extremely likely we will face rising sea levels, heat waves that will occur more often and last longer and extreme weather events that will become more intense and frequent. The effects of climate change are unevenly distributed, causing the most damage to the most vulnerable groups the world over.

After the demonstration in Windrush Square a delegation of UNISON members headed to Central London with the branch banners to join the protests and show solidarity with the school strikers who were leading the marches from all over the country.
